3. **Hours Needed:** 24/7 supports. Recent TA recommends own home or apartment, with 2 staff 24/7.

5. **Service(s) Needed:** HPC, HPC transportation and Day Program
6. **Essential service preferences:** : HPC staff that are trained in Behavior support strategies

- **Supervision Levels:**
 - Community: Constant visual
 - Home: Constant visual
 - Overnight hours: HPC
 - At day program: B = 1:6
- **Medical/Medication/Health:** Individual has a history of gastrointestinal issues (acid reflux). Administer medication/schedule and assist for all medical care.
- **Behavioral/Psychiatric:** Individual is a 18 yr. old male of approximate 5'9" and 158lbs with diagnosis of: Autistic Disorder; Bipolar Disorder, mixed episodes, severe with psychotic features; Attention Deficit hyperactivity disorder, combined type. His intellectual IQ is 71. Individual struggles with his mental health, and has had incidents of suicidal and homicidal thoughts/actions in the past. He struggles to cope with stress in a positive way. Medication list available upon request.
- **Behaviors include suicidal threats, aggression towards others including physical attempts to harm others by choking and biting.**
 - Individual can be physically aggressive when he is upset, and has injured others and himself in the past due to this. He may also destroy property when he is upset or anxious. In the past he has done things like scrape the paint off of walls and break the handles off toilets. Due to individual's psychiatric diagnoses, he also sometimes hears voices when he is upset that tell him to do inappropriate or dangerous things when he is upset. Individual has a hard time communicating things that are stressful to him, and struggles to cope with stress. He will do things like rock back and forth, frown, and/or put his head down

when he is starting to get upset. It is important for staff to try to watch for signs that he is becoming upset and to suggest positive coping skills like taking time away and/or covering up with his favorite blanket for comfort. It can sometimes make him more upset to have people talking to him when he is upset, so going to a private area to calm down is often the most helpful thing to do. It's also important for staff to know the things that are stressful to him such as: lots of noise, people screaming, feeling like he or others around him are being threatened, feeling like he's being told what to do, and feeling like he doesn't have any say in things that are happening to him.

- Individual may threaten or try to hurt himself when he is upset. In the past he has done things like wrap wires around a pipe, in what he claims was an attempt to "do suicide." When he threatens to or tries to hurt himself it is important for staff to contact emergency services immediately.
- Individual is not able to be around children unsupervised due to past charges of sexual assault when he was a minor. A competency evaluation was completed on 2/8/2018 by the Forensic Center and was determined unable to understand the nature and objective of legal proceedings or the capacity to assist in his defense.
- He has a history of being a victim of sexual abuse and does not have a good understanding of what is appropriate with others. Staff are right with him in the community and do not leave him unsupervised, especially around children.
- Individual has two criminal charges currently pending against him: disorderly conduct and felonious assault. It is important for staff to help him comply with court orders and attend hearing as required.
- Individual has struggled with his mental health, and has had instances of suicidal and homicidal thoughts/actions in the past. He struggles to cope with stress in a positive way. It is important that he receive his medications regularly and attend psychiatric/counseling appointments as directed so that he does not experience further decline in mental health.
- Individual has a long trauma history. It is critically important that the individual feels safe and secure in every environment, by every staff, every day.

- **Hygiene/ADL/Personal Care:** Individual requires mostly verbal prompts and reminders for personal care/ ADL's.
- **Mealtime/Cooking/Household Maintenance:** Individual requires assistance. Provider would be responsible. He is able to pour himself a bowl of cereal or make a sandwich that does not require cutting.
- **Money Management:** Individual requires full assistance with money. Individual does not consistently identify or count money and would be very easily taken advantage if he were to make transactions on his own. He needs staff to talk him through transactions to make sure he gives the correct amount of money and gets all of his change back.
- **Transportation:** Provider would be responsible for transportation needs.
- **Mobility/Transfers/Positioning:** There are no mobility concerns. Individual is able to ambulate and transfer.
- **Equipment needs/accessibility needs:** Individual has no adaptive equipment.
- **Communication:** Individual is verbal and able to make his wants and needs known. However, he does have articulation deficits.
- **Current living or day program/employment arrangement:** Individual is currently in a respite home in Massillon, Ohio (Stark County). The Guardian is requesting individual move into Trumbull County to be closer to family.
- **Forensic supports/Criminal background:** Individual has been on probation and is currently incarcerated at Trumbull County Juvenile Justice Center, on Domestic Violence charges, against his Adoptive Mother (who is also his maternal grandmother), until his court hearing on 8/14/2018. He has been deemed incompetent, so the courts will not be able to adjudicate him and must release him at his next court date.
- **Provider Information:**
 - a. **Specific provider skills/knowledge/training requests:** Behavior Support, able to work with explosive and sexualized behaviors, and intervene when necessary.
 - b. **Type of provider requested:** Residential and Day Programming (24 hour services).
 - c. **Location of Services:** Trumbull/Mahoning
